

Elden Pueblo – Online and On-site Programs

Where Outdoor Science Meets History



During these difficult times, the Elden Pueblo Project would like to offer your class a choice of programs. We will continue to offer our traditional outdoor programs as well as an on-line, interactive 45-minute lesson on prehistoric culture at Elden Pueblo.

- ❖ **ON-LINE** - This program follows the site's trail stops through a 360-degree virtual-tour view. Paired with a live presentation that contains photos, facts, and information not usually available at the site-based program, we provide a behind-the-scenes view of research at the site.
 - **Your online class presentation can be scheduled anytime this semester**, as we're not limited by outdoor weather conditions. We just need a ZOOM invitation to join your class.
- **OUTDOOR PROGRAMS** - Programs typically run from 9:30 am-1:30pm, conducted April through October at the Elden Pueblo site.
 - ❖ **The Elden Archaeology Project.** This is our core exploration in the science of archaeology in our own backyard. Students will have a pre-history lesson of the Pueblo, interpretive excavations, artifact analysis, and primitive hunting games. **3rd through 8th grade.**
 - ❖ **Humans as Part of the Environment.** This is a ¾-mile hike through history, focused on using Vegetation Transect Surveys to determine human impact on the environment, while studying the local history. This program is well suited for Native American youth, as we explore history without physically being on the ruins site. **5th through high school**
 - ❖ **Youth as Stewards.** This is a service-learning program, providing services-hour credits for middle and-upper school classes, through promoting stewardship ideals. Students have a two-part curriculum - an off-site field survey and on-site work project. This year's projects include trail and ruins maintenance and an interpretive botany walk. Middle & High School.
