


Elden Pueblo – Online and On-site Programs

Where Outdoor Science Meets History



Elden Pueblo Project offers your class both **ONLINE** and **SITE-BASED** field trip programs. We have 25 FREE grant-supported programs available.

➤ **ON-LINE** - This 45-60 minute program on ZOOM allows your class to follow the site's trail stops through a 360-degree virtual-tour, learning the secrets of Elden Pueblo. This live presentation shows photos, facts, and information not usually available at the site-based program. **Your online class presentation can be scheduled anytime this semester**, as we're not limited by outdoor weather conditions. We just need a ZOOM invitation to join your class.



- **OUTDOOR PROGRAMS** - Programs typically run from 9:30 am-1:30 pm, conducted April through October at the Elden Pueblo site. Bring lunch, water, hat, closed-toe shoes and your sense of adventure.



- ❖ **The Elden Archaeology Project.** This is our core exploration in the science of archaeology in our own backyard. Students will have a pre-history lesson of the Pueblo, interpretive excavations, artifact analysis, and primitive hunting games. For **3rd through 8th grade**.
- ❖ **Humans as Part of the Environment.** This is a ¾-mile hike through history, studying local road building and fire management over time to determine human impact on the environment and plants. This program is well suited for Native American youth with cultural sensitivities, as we explore history without physically being on the ruins site. For **4th through high school**
- ❖ **Youth as Stewards.** This is a service-learning program, providing services-hour credits for middle and-upper school classes, through promoting stewardship ideals. Students have a two-part curriculum - an off-site field survey and on-site work project. This year's projects include trail and ruins maintenance and an interpretive botany walk. For **middle & high school**.
