WHEN: Saturday May 10, from 10 am-2 pm.


WHAT: We're going to plant a prehistoric garden of corn, beans and squash in the traditional drainages along Elden Pueblo.

Learn about ancient uses of local plants and how check dams were made to create garden fields. Bring garden gloves, hat, sunscreen, water and your sense of adventure!

June 7 Fun with Clay Make a clay owl figurine or a coil pot. We will also provide short overview of ancient pottery techniques.

July 5 Basic Weaving Weave a colorful coaster on a cardboard loom and learn about the history of weaving in the southwest.

July 26 Jewelry Making Make and decorate a necklace or bracelet. Learn a short history of materials and methods used by ancient artisans.

August 9 Native Cooking We'll practice corn grinding with a mano and metate. Then use blue corn meal to make corn cakes, topped with prickly pear jelly!
